^The ideology & movement on which the colonial project of Israeli state building in Palestine is founded & continues

^Maximum land in Palestine for the State of Israel with minimum number of Palestinians

Origin and Principles

- Established at the Fifth Zionist Congress, Basel, 1901.
- The JNF's mission to buy land in 'Eretz Israel', for the settlement of Jews.
- JNF land, 'inalienable property of Jewish people' and is for sole use of Jewish people.
- JNF expressly prohibited from selling its land



The 'village files'

The JNF had special units which collected information and built what was known as the 'village files'

These included:

- Aerial photographs
- Topographical maps
- Quality of village land, including water sources
- Detailed records of their inhabitants
- Names of those involved in resisting the British and Zionist



JNF and the Nakba

The JNF played a large role in the Nakba ('catastrophe'), which was the process of ethnic cleansing of Palestinians from their land by Zionist militias and the State of Israel between 1947-1949


The 'village files' drawn up by JNF, were primary reference for Zionist forces executing depopulation and destruction of Palestinian communities



After the Nakba

- 1949 and 1950 acquisitions of ‘abandoned’ or absentees’ land.
- The Palestinians who owned the land and are now refugees or Internally Displaced People, have never been paid for the land which was taken from them.
- By 1956 the JNF had increased its share of land from 3.5% to 13% of the land of what is now Israel.
- 72% of JNF land was acquired after May 1948, these acquisitions were illegal under Geneva Convention.
- The JNF’s role in the illegal expropriation of this land and its redevelopment makes the JNF complicit in the denial of the Palestinian refugees Right of Return.
- In 1950 the JNF-KKL drained Lake Hula in the interests of agricultural development. Once rich with diverse animal and plant life, today the area is a barren desert

Fact: Land Administration (ILA)

- The ILA is responsible for administering the 93% of Israeli land owned by the state (80%) and the JNF (13%).
- The ILA was established in 1960 to be run by a council of 22 members of which, from the start, the JNF was granted 10 seats.
- As part of the ILA, the JNF can represent Israel in international proceedings having to do with land.
- JNF have influential role within the structure of the Israeli state. However, they are legally independent from the state.

“Entrusting the Jewish peoples’ land to the JNF frees the State of Israel, even though it is the state of the Jewish people, from having to deal with this [of discriminating against Palestinians] issue and in so doing violate the principle of equality.” ~Tom Segev

Canada Park

As part of the process of occupying the West Bank, 3 Palestinian villages, Imwas, Yalu and Beit Nuba. They were demolished and those living there forcibly removed. Established in 1973 with funds from JNF-Canada, Canada Park is planted on the ruins of these villages to cover up the land theft and displacement.

the on-going history of destruction and displacement

- Plants non-indigenous trees that destroy native plants and habitat
- Plant trees that are not suited for environment and cause deadly and destructive forest fires
- Destroy natural environments for the purposes of developing Israeli agricultural projects and settlements
- As part of this on-going destruction, the JNF has...
 - Planted over 250 million non-indigenous trees
 - “Developed” over 250,000 acres for settlement
 - Planted over 1000 “parks”
 - Created 180 dams and reservoirs



JNF today

- Branded as an environmental charity.
- Focuses on planting trees, developing land for settlement and creating parks.
- Enjoys charitable status in over 50 countries.
- Support from high profile individuals.



Blueprint Negev

- Heavily supported by the JNF USA.
- Systematic discrimination against the indigenous Bedouin community.
- Al-Araqib has been demolished more than 20 times over the past several years.
- The JNF has been involved in Jewish settlement of

JNF in the United States
